<u>Curriculum Areas and Subjects</u> Mostly the children will learn these subjects on their own. The knowledge and skills they learn can be transferred between subjects.

Literacy and Languages

In writing this term we will apply our learning about VCOP to write setting and character descritptions and creative stories. We will be using the Egyptians as a stimulus for creating adventure stories, focussing on a beginning, middle and ending.

In reading, children will develop their comprehension through group discussions and a variety of

comprehension through group discussions and a variety of independent and group activities. Within groups we will conintue to use questions following Bloom's Taxonomy, promoting Higher Order Thinking Skills within reading, listening and talking. Later in the term we will be developing our note-taking skills using videos, texts and websites to explore different styles of note-taking. We will then use our notes to create new texts and prepare presentations to deliver in

In **French** we will be learning classroom instructions and how to say where we live.

<u>PE</u> will be taught by Mr Rae and the class teacher. The children will be working on creativity, cooperation, rhythm and timing in relation to gymnastics skills and country dancing.

Building Resilience

The second unit within the Building Resilience Programme, 'Keep Connected', will teach children the importance of caring and positive relationships and the contribution other people make to our well-being.

The three key messages are:

Relationships are important for our health and wellbeing Belonging to a group can be a good way of building friendships Good relationships are a two-way thing

Numeracy and Maths

Within numeracy we will further develop different strategies for the four functions and work on our security of number facts, such as number bonds, doubles and near doubles to help us to get quicker with these.

Within maths we will be exploring the use of money, identifying coins, notes and calculating the total value of these.

We will also investigate measurement and the need for standard units, as well as practicing using measurement instruments within length, weight and volume.

Ethos and Life of the School The children work hard to have a positive ethos at Roseburn Primary School. The children are all part of the life and work of school.

This term we will:

- earn House points through demonstrating our school values and behaviour policy
- create a class museum to share our learning about the Egyptians
- create a product during 'Enterprise Week' and make our own advertisement for it, presenting to the rest of the school
- sell our 'Enterprise Week' product at the Christmas Fair
 - take part in the Christmas Service in December

Enterprise

This term we will have our own enterprise project where children will collectively make decisions about the content of the project, the distribution of jobs and the budget. What we make will then be sold at the Christmas fair, allowing us to explore profit and loss.

Dance

Pupils will continue to work with a variety of classical and contemporary music to choreograph short dance sequences with a focus on travel, turn, jump, pause and levels.

Interdisciplinary Learning - Ancient Egyptians
