What things can you spot changing in the environment around you? Can you see flowers sprouting? Leaf buds growing? Different birds appearing?</p>
<p><u>*Numeracy*</u></p> <p><u>I can share out a group of items by making smaller groups and can split a whole object into smaller parts.</u></p> <p>Sharing is an important skill to learn. Can you help share out treats for your friends or for your toys? How about dividing something like a cake into halves or quarters? See how many pieces of cutlery everyone needs for dinner, or how many fingers everyone has.</p>	<p><u>Modern Languages</u></p> <p>This term the children will be learning about how to say things that they like (j'aime)! Can they think about what colours they like? Or perhaps French foods that they like to eat? (maybe a baguette, crepe, pain au chocolat or croissant)</p>	<p><u>Personal Challenge</u></p> <p>Recycling time! Rather than putting your plastics in the bin, bring it into school ready for some junk modelling.</p>
