FRIENDS OF ROSEBURN PARK MURAL

Our p7 pupils were invited to take part in the construction of a mural in Roseburn Park on Thursday. The mural will be located on the Armoury building in the middle of the park; a rare surviving example of a Second World War civil defence building. This served an important role for Edinburgh's Air Raid Protection (ARP) on the home front and was also the setting for a wartime propaganda film on the work of the ARP service.

The mural will be unveiled by the Lord Provost on Sunday 1 September at 2pm, marking 80 years since the beginning of WW2.
