## WHAT IS SWAP?

**SWAP** is the Nuffield Schools Wellbeing Activity Programme, designed to empower pupils to improve their wellbeing.

Nuffield Health is a trading charity; proactively responding to the key health issues facing young people today. Their programme is free, making it accessible to all and is supporting us to incorporate further health and wellbeing lessons into their weekly learning. The 6 week programme is delivered by SWAP champions and another adult, this may include doctors, physiotherapists, physiologists, cognitive behavioural therapists and fitness instructors. The programme focuses on four key themes:

P6 and p7 started the programme on Thursday.

How I Move: focusing on physical activity

How I Eat: focusing on sugar content of food and drinks, hydration, fruit and vegetables How I Sleep: focusing on sleep, sleep hygiene and screen time How I Feel: focusing on emotional wellbeing and resilience.

## SHELTER ASSEMBLY

Georgina the Regional Community Fundraiser for Shelter Scotland in Edinburgh came along to our assemblies today. She shared her role in the charity Shelter. Through a quiz the children learnt about the work Shelter do to support the homeless, those at risk of becoming homeless, and those who do not have warm or safe homes. Ask your child if they can remember how many children were homeless in Scotland last year?

Georgina also shared the different types of fundraising activities she has been involved in. I wonder what great ideas they will come up with?
