Tues 24 th Mar	Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 20 Minutes: Read some more of the library book you read yesterday and answer some remembering and understanding questions. Use your blooms fans.• Have a go at writing the second part of the Jack and the Beanstalk story. It is important you remember the classroom writing targets (I have uploaded a picture for you in case you have forgotten).• If this is tricky, use the Writing sheet to help you remember key words and tricky words.• Spelling: Practise your 'ow' words. You can grapheme mark, create alien words, find 'ow' words in books and write some interesting sentences.
	Maths and Numeracy	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Fractions – Halves. Complete two pages of your Money and Fractions workbook. Starting with the page 'Colour one half of each shape'. Apologies some will have photocopied books which are not as easy to read page numbers.
	French	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Sumdog – use your log in.• Have a look at the French activities you have in your home learning pack.• Have a look at this website. Remember we are learning about classroom objects in French.
