

## Numeracy

In P1, we always start our number lessons with some counting songs. Here is a fun song we use regularly in class:

### 1. Counting backwards from 30:

\*Continue practising the 'Counting to 100' song and 'Counting back from 20'

### 2. Choose one task from the 'P1 Numeracy Home Learning Ideas' sheet (in your home learning pack) to practise your number work

**Maths: Money** (\*Please remember, these money activities are only provided as suggestions).

- I can pay for an item using the correct coin, e.g. a 5p coin for an item costing 5p
- I can apply addition skills and use 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p coins to pay the exact value for items for 10p

### 3. How much money in each bag?

Lay out coins (**up to 10p**) in different groups to represent each person's 'bag', e.g.:

- Ben (2p, 1p)
- Lucy (2p, 2p)
- Jane (5p, 1p)
- Nick (2p, 2p, 2p, 1p)
- Jack (5p, 2p, 2p, 1p)
- Jemma (2p, 2p, 1p)
- Claire (5p, 2p, 2p)
- Sarah (5p, 2p, 1p)

Ask 'How much money is in Ben's/Lucy's... bag?' 'Who has the most/least money?'

### 4. Toy Shop

Label some toys around the house **up to 10p** (6p, 7p, 8p, 9p, 10p). Ask your child to hand you the correct coins to pay for each item.
