Key Vocabulary

Noun: Name things, object, places or people.

Proper Noun: Begin with a capital letter and name people, places, organisations or unique things.

Adjective: A describing word.

Conjunctions: Joining words, they link two simple sentences together.

Alphabet Races Write out an alphabet of nouns . Challenge yourself by sticking to a topic. For example, Fruit A – Apple B – Banana C – Cherry	Grammar Detective: Nouns and Proper Nouns Write out a list of nouns and proper nouns you can find in your books at home.	Noun Towers Think of a noun and answer these questions: What is it? dog What is it like? A white dog Where is it? A white dog on the road What is it doing? A white dog on the road is growling at me.
Adjective Alphabet Races Write out an alphabet of adjectives. For example, A is for angry B is for beautiful C is for Crazy	Grammar Detective: Adjectives Write out a list of adjectives you can find in your books at home.	The Adjective Generator How many adjectives can you think of in a time limit? Think of adjectives under these headings: Descriptive, colour, size, feelings. Another way to play this game is to list adjectives to do with your senses. The headings could be: touch, taste, look, smell and hear.
Linking sentences. Write out some sentences using 'and' or 'but'. You can try to include both!	Grammar Detective: and/but Have a look in your books and see if you can find 'and' or 'but' in sentences.	Sentence Construction Write out some sentences (they can be silly) that have nouns, adjectives and linking words.

Remember you can only use 'and' and 'but' once in a sentence.	Write some good sentences and highlight the conjunction.	
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
