Key Vocabulary

Noun: Name of things, object, places or people.

Proper Noun: Begins with a capital letter, name of a person, place, organisation or unique thing.

Adjective: A describing word.

Conjunctions: Joining words, they link two simple sentences together.

For example, Fruit A – Apple B – Banana C – Cherry</p>	<p>Grammar Detective: Nouns and Proper Nouns Write out a list of nouns and proper nouns you can find in your books at home.</p>	<p>Noun Towers Think if a noun and answer these questions: What is it? dog What it is like? Think of adjectives under these headings: Descriptive, colour, size, feelings. Another way to play this game is to list adjectives to do with your senses. The headings could be: touch, taste, look, smell and hear.</p>
<p>Linking sentences.</p>	<p>Grammar Detective: and/but</p>	<p>Sentence Construction Write out some sentences that have nouns, adjectives and linking words.</p>
