#### 1. I can point to and hear each separate word.

Keep up the reading!

### 2. I can blend phonemes to read words.

This week our focus is **double letters**. In some words, the same letter is repeated twice. We do not need to sound both of them out – we can just say it once.

## 4. I can write a sentence.

Each week, we practise a dictation sentence. We:

- Look at the sentence together.
- Read it out loud in lots of different silly voices.
- Count how many words there are.
- Talk about the capital letter at the start, the finger spaces between words and the full stop at the end.
- Spell each word together and spot anything that might make the word tricky.
- Have a go at writing the sentence without peeking.
- Check the original to see whether we have managed to get it correct.
