Maths: data handling

Intended learning:

We are learning to measure rooms and familiar areas using an appropriate unit of measurement.

Activity

Watch BBC bitesize clips of measurement. These can be found **here**.

Use an appropriate unit of measurement and measurement tool to measure the following objects:

- Door
- Table
- TV/laptop/tablet screen
- Cooking Utensil
- Length and width of a room

Extension

Compare the various differences in lengths between objects, and apply your number skills to help calculate these differences.

Literacy: Reading






What does the word 'propaganda' mean?
