Turn them around in your hands to see the different views. - Have a look on the website on Wednesday for Miss Fraser's "Spot the 3D shape" challenge.</p>	<p>Maths: Number Intended learning: Adding 2 digit numbers Number fact consolidation Activities: - Try the activity on page 16 of the Heinemann textbook in your home learning pack. If you want to make it more challenging you could try making 3 digit numbers! - Have a look at the Mental Maths Calendar grid for May. Choose a few activities to try. - Try page 31 in the activity book that has been emailed to you. It is called "Maths Activity 2".</p>	<p>Literacy: reading/spelling Intended learning: Correctly spell words with the "ey/ei/i" sound Practice and extend knowledge of tricky words Activities: - Try Miss Fraser's mild/spicy/hot spelling challenge on the website or Twitter page. -Read for enjoyment every day. - Try page 13 in the activity book that has been emailed to you. It is called "Tricky words". (instructions are on pg 12)</p>	<p>Literacy: writing/handwriting Intended learning: Write an imaginative story using the theme "Imagine if" Remember to check back over what you have written to check it makes sense. Activities: -Choose one of these or create your own: Imagine if you were shrunk down to the size of a pencil, Imagine you were in charge of the world, Imagine your pet could talk. -Handwriting practice. We are working on these top joins: "ok" and "of". Check website on Friday to see what it should look like.</p>
<p>Literacy: Listening and talking Intended learning: Explain how someone else might be feeling. Activity: What do you think are the challenges or changes for people doing these jobs during lockdown? Hairdresser/ Pilot/ Nurse/Actor Shopkeeper/Teacher/Bus driver</p>	<p>Modern Language: French Intended learning: Revise colours Activity -Try page 91 in the activity book that has been emailed to you. It is called "Language activity 1". - Choose an activity from www.linguascope.com</p>	<p>Health & Wellbeing Intended learning: Develop throwing skills Activity: Set up target to throw at. At intervals, place cones/markers in a line stretching back from the target. The aim of the game is to throw a ball to hit the target. After each successful throw, move further back to the next cone/marker and try again</p>	<p>Topic- Water experiments Intended learning: Explore the concept of floating and sinking Activity: -Float an apple in fresh water. What happens when you add salt to the water? -An orange floats, but without its peel it sinks. Build an artificial peel that will enable an orange to float.</p>
