Our numeracy focus will be number formation, addition, and subtraction

- To read, write and order whole numbers to at least 30

- To be able to identify the value of each digit in a whole number with two digits. 86 = 80 + 6
- To count forwards and backwards in 2's, 5's, 10's.
- Demonstrate understanding that 6+3=3+6
- Formation and direction of numbers

Our Maths focus will be shape and pattern

- To name, identify and classify and range of 2D shapes and 3D objects. To use mathematical language to describe their properties.
- To continue both repeating patterns in numbers and symbols.
