Ethos & Vision

- Roseburn continues to be a welcoming, inclusive, and nurturing school community.
- The school's core values—Rights, Respect, Relationships, Resilience, and Responsibility—are embedded in everyday practice.
- Learners are encouraged to *Dream, Believe, Achieve*, with a strong focus on wellbeing, equity, and pupil voice.

Learning & Achievement

- High attainment in literacy and numeracy continues across all stages.
- Almost all learners in P1, P4, and P7 achieved expected levels in core areas.
- Staff use robust tracking systems to ensure every child is supported and challenged appropriately.

Progress with Priorities

Roseburn made strong progress across its key improvement priorities:

Learning, Teaching & Assessment

• Staff delivered consistently high-quality learning experiences, with a focus on engagement, differentiation, and assessment for learning. Outdoor learning and digital tools were used effectively to enrich the curriculum.

Equity & Inclusion

 Targeted interventions supported learners with additional needs, including those with dyslexia and EAL. The school strengthened its inclusive practices and received formal accreditation in Dyslexia and Literacy Support.

Pupil Voice & Leadership

 Children played an active role in shaping their learning environment and school improvement. Class Leadership Teams such as Rights Respecters, ECO Warriors, Equalities & Diversity Team, Playground Team, JRSOs and House Captains led meaningful initiatives.

Sustainability & Rights

 Roseburn earned its 7th Green Flag and a Highly Commended Sustainability Award. The school was re-accredited as a Gold Rights Respecting School, with children confidently articulating their rights and responsibilities.



• The school achieved the Digital Schools Scotland Award, recognising its commitment to digital innovation and safe, purposeful use of technology in learning.

Early Years

- The nursery continues to provide a nurturing, child-led environment, with strong relationships and responsive planning.
- Staff support emotional literacy and wellbeing through play, storytelling, and outdoor experiences.

Parental Engagement

- The Roseburn School Parent Partnership (RSPP) played a vital role in fundraising, community events, and school improvement.
- Families were actively involved in learning sessions, consultations, and celebrations of pupil achievements.

Safeguarding & Wellbeing

- Safeguarding procedures are robust and regularly reviewed.
- Staff provide targeted wellbeing support, including nurture groups and therapeutic outdoor learning.
- Almost all children report feeling safe, respected, and supported at school.

Areas for discussion

The poil Equity Fund is provided by the Scottish Government to help schools close the poverty-related attainment gap. Funding is allocated based on the number of pupils eligible for free school meals.

- £14,700- £6900 currently funds the Roseburn share of Learning Community Pupil Support
 Officer (attendance focus-Fri am) & Learning Community Attainment Transition Teacher
 (maths focus -Tue all day)
- £7,600 currently funds Pupil Support Assistant hours supporting some literacy & numeracy
- £200 currently supports reducing the cost of the school day

This provides

Targeted Support for Learners

- Enhanced staffing and resources to support literacy and numeracy for identified pupils
- Small group interventions and one-to-one support led by teachers and support staff
- Focus on improving outcomes for learners facing barriers to learning
- Support for uniform & trips
